



Loan Activity

During the fiscal year April 1, 2012 to March 31, 2013, CBDC Celtic assessed twenty-one business plans for financing, fifteen of which were approved and six declined. Financial assistance was provided to five new businesses and six existing businesses for a total of \$1,000,116.

As of March 31, 2013, CBDC Celtic's loan portfolio was comprised of forty-six loans with a total value of \$2.45 million.

Self Employment Assistance

This program assists people who are Employment Insurance eligible to start their own business. In the fiscal year 2012 - 2013 CBDC Celtic received and assessed eight business plans for application for support through Self Employment Assistance Program; five were approved, two declined by the Department of Advanced Education and Skills and one withdrawn by client.

Annual Meeting

St. Mary's provided a warm welcome to CBDC Celtic in October when we held our annual general meeting in the town. A large group of residents turned out to hear about our annual activities and hear Patrick Monsigneur talk about the tourism potential of the region. Patrick has experienced that potential first hand since taking over the beautiful Claddagh Inn. His promotion of the Inn and the reputation it has secured as a beautiful stay with good food and warm hospitality certainly has contributed to drawing people into the region. Patrick believes that the synergy obtained from people working together to promote the region can mean increased visitation and opportunities for development. Patrick and his wife Carol catered a reception at the Inn following the meeting – further proof of good food and warm hospitality.

Planning Session

CBDC Celtic held a planning session on January 10 and 11, 2014 to review our operations and set a course for future activity. Our plans focused on getting out in our communities more to talk about our programs and the ways we can help business development in the region. Youth Ventures Program Co-ordinator

CBDC Celtic is offering the **Youth Ventures Program** this summer. The Program involves promoting and fostering entrepreneurship among students from Goulds/Petty Harbour-Maddox Cove to Riverhead, St. Mary's Bay. The position will be based in Ferryland and requires travel throughout the region.

Preference will be given to individuals who have completed or are currently enrolled in a business degree or business studies program. Access to a vehicle is required. Salary is \$1,050 biweekly. Only those selected for an interview will be contacted.
