One such new service was the delivery of the CAS program - Consulting Advisory Services. Programs such as this, delivered in partnership with Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency, are opening more doors for ventures in rural Newfoundland and Labrador to sustainably compete in a global environment.



On March 31, 2015 the net value of the CBDC portfolio was \$93.5 million





SEA (Self Employment Assistance Program)

CBDCs work in partnership with the provincial Department of Advanced Education and Skills to deliver SEA. All SEA applicants receive business counseling from the CBDC and 20 percent usually receive additional CBDC loans. In 2014-15, CBDCs worked with 141 approved SEA clients.

Consulting Advisory Services

CBDCs have been working with businesses, municipalities and community enterprises to help grow and sustain ventures and projects via expert consulting advice. New and existing clients can access technical and financial assistance by engaging consultants to assist them with business opportunities and challenges.




CBDC Avalon West provides business advice, counselling, consulting, training and financing services to entrepreneurs within the Cape Shore, Isthmus, St. Mary's Bay North and Placentia regions of the Province. The Corporation has eight dedicated directors who meet at a minimum of once per month to review loans applications and requests. Two directors, ensuring equal geographic representation, represent each of the sub-regions. The region is extensively rural in nature, and has a population of approximately 8,000 people. Historically, the region has been heavily reliant upon the fishing industry. Due to large industrial developments that are occurring within or near the region (Long Harbour, Bull Arm and Argentia), the construction, mining and the oil and gas sectors are providing direct employment for residents and these industries are having an overall positive economic impact. Spinoff effects from these developments are being felt in the accommodations, service and retail sectors. CBDC Avalon West continues to build on its relationships with its partners within the economic development and business financing sectors in order to grow and enhance the local business community. The opportunities for local businesses are great and CBDC Avalon West is well positioned to provide assistance.


CBDC Burin Peninsula represents some 33 small towns and communities with a combined population of approximately 23,000 people. The mandate of the corporation is to create jobs through small business development.

The local Burin Peninsula economy is driven mainly by the fishery and employment at the Cow Head metal fabrication site. However, an inflatable air shelter manufacturing operation and the region's service sector creates significant local employment opportunities as well. The region enjoys a robust retail sector resulting mainly from employment levels relating to the fishery and oil related metal fabrication work at the Cow Head site. In addition, many skilled tradespersons commute off the Burin Peninsula on a regular basis to pursue opportunities related to the bigger industrial projects within the province as well as in Western Canada. The region's close proximity to the French Islands of St. Pierre & Miguelon results in tourist traffic through the region of some 15,000 people annually, in addition to those that visit the Burin Peninsula for the many attractions that the region has to offer.

The CBDC small business financing programs and services are a good fit for the many businesses throughout the region, and our historical lending activity is a good reflection of this.



CBDC Celtic has served the communities from Goulds and Petty Harbour/Maddox Cove to Mall Bay, St. Mary's Bay for 24 years. Our office is located in Ferryland.

Our region has a rich cultural heritage and a growing tourism industry with significant tourist anchors such as the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve, Colony of Avalon, Mistaken Point Ecological Reserve (nominee for UNESCO World Heritage nomination), Holyrood Pond and St. Vincent's Beach. The 22 communities served, with a total population of 15,900 stretch out over 205 kilometers. The region encompasses a rural and growing urban area. We have a variety of industries that include the fishery, seafood processing, tourism, manufacturing and sales and services. CBDC Celtic has supported businesses in all these sectors as well as construction, agriculture and social enterprise. In the 24 years since inception we have disbursed 260 loans and over \$11 M to businesses in our area.

In addition to lending, advice and support to businesses, we also provide training opportunities, administer the Self Employment Assistance Program and the Youth Ventures Program. Self Employment Assistance provides a living allowance for eligible Employment Insurance clients who start a business. Youth Ventures offers encouragement and support to young people who have an interest in entrepreneurship.

Our organization is governed by volunteers from within our communities and we hold an annual general meeting each year in October. The past two years, we have taken our annual meeting on the road and held it in sub-regions within our boundary.



CBDC Central represents approximately 25 towns and communities in Central Newfoundland from Buchans in the west to Norris Arm, Fortune Harbour and Leading Tickles in the east with a combined population of 26,190. The success of the Corporation's 34 years can be attributed to being Governed by a volunteer Board of Directors. The objective of the Corporation is to provide access to financing, business counselling and entrepreneurial training opportunities.

2014/15 has been another successful year for CBDC-Central with \$1.61M disbursed to 31 businesses throughout the region. As of March 31, 2015 loans outstanding in the region totaled \$5.55M. Our activity within the region is also attributed to the strong partnerships forged with organizations such as ACOA, Department of Advanced Education & Skills, BDC, Qualipu, NLOWE, the Chamber of Commerce, traditional banks along with municipalities within the region.

As you will see from the lending by sector, the Central area is well diversified as the major service center for many communities in the region and beyond.



Eastern Initiatives



CBDC Eastern Initiatives is located in Clarenville and offers its services to the Bonavista Peninsula, Random Island and the communities situated between and including Arnold's Cove, Swift Current, and Port Blandford. The Corporation currently operates under the control of a local volunteer Board of Directors comprised of eight members.

Now entering its 23rd year of operation, CBDC Eastern Initiatives continues to deliver to its clients: access to financing, business counselling and entrepreneurial training opportunities. During the 2014-15 year, the CBDC provided \$774K in repayable loans to 20 businesses, conducted 244 counselling sessions and assisted 21 individuals in accessing business training to better manage their businesses.

As of March 31, 2015, loans outstanding in the community totaled \$4.6M through our core lending programs. Support is offered to a wide variety of sectors including Tourism, Retail, Other/Service and Fish Harvesting to name a few. CBDC Eastern Initiatives is fortunate to reside in an area with such a strong, diversified economy!

Additionally, the CBDC continues to partner with the Department of Advanced Education and Skills to help new entrepreneurs access the Self-Employment Assistance Program. During the past year, the CBDC assisted six clients in accessing the program and starting their own businesses.

CBDC Eastern Initiatives hosts an Annual Stakeholders Meeting each year in October. This event is open to the public and provides an opportunity to learn more about the organization's activities and results.

We look forward to another successful year providing financial support and guidance to existing businesses and aspiring entrepreneurs in our region!

CBDC Gateway is governed by an engaged volunteer board of directors that is committed to the principles of transparency, accountability and confidentiality.


